



Edison High School offers Dual Enrollment to its high school junior and senior students. “Dual Enrollment” refers to a program where students take high school courses at Edison High School for which they also earn college credit from Eastern Gateway Community College. The Dual Enrollment Program at Edison High School is based on an agreement between the administration from Edison and the administration at EGCC. Our Edison teachers are certified through EGCC to teach the selected courses.

During February of each year, students must present their high school teachers with their course requests for the next school year. Students are enrolled in an honors class at Edison that is equivalent to a college course at EGCC. Students receive both high school and college credit for these classes. The available college level courses are included on the Schedule Request Sheet that students must complete in order to take said classes and be a part of said program. Currently, 14 college courses, encompassing 47 college credits, are available to Edison High School juniors and seniors.

Students receive an application for EGCC from the Guidance office, specifically from Mrs. Arlotta. Students must then complete this application to EGCC and present qualifying scores from their ACT exam on the COMPASS Test (a college placement test given at EGCC).

The completed and signed applications are due March 30th; this deadline is assigned by the state of Ohio. Parents are also required to attend a student-counselor-parent meeting to be scheduled at the end of March. Papers will be signed during these meetings.

Typically, more than 30% of the junior and senior classes participate in this program each year. This opportunity of dual enrollment challenges students to take the initiative in getting the most out of their high school education at Edison.

Dual enrollment provides students with the option to be intellectually tested. It gives them a head start on their career by saving money on college tuition and allowing them to get core (entry-level) classes completed before ever setting foot

on a college campus. This, in turn, permits them to possibly graduate earlier than expected.

The following courses are accessible to students in the dual enrollment program offered at Edison and agreed upon by Eastern Gateway Community College.
