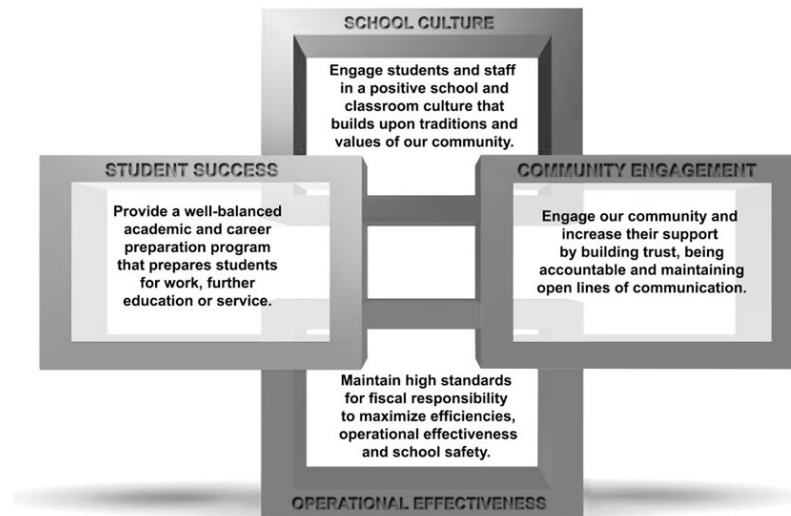

Summer 2021	Students in grades 3 through 12 will be offered credit recovery through a combination of online learning and face to face support. The focus will be on reading and math. Students in grade K through 2 will be offered structured language and reading comprehension instruction. This will be offered 3 days a week for 6 weeks. Transportation and lunch will be provided.	Students in grades 1 through 6 will be given the opportunity to participated in “Little CAT Day Camp” (Community, Activity, Togetherness) a three-day camp that focuses on social emotion learning through outdoor physical activities. Special populations will be given preference in scheduling. Transportation and lunch will be provided.	District Leadership Teams and Building Level Teams will meet over the summer to begin to plan for needed professional learning supports that are need for the 2021-2022 school year. The teams will review district, school and trends data to determine need of focus
